The position: The **ideal applicant** will provide **evidence** of 1) providing case management throughout the duration of treatment; 2) ensuring the program has family-focused services and is trauma-informed; 3) providing and conducting trauma-informed treatments groups using “Seeking Safety” curricula; 4) mental health structured therapeutic services and gender-responsive trauma-informed treatment services; 5) giving services offered in the context of family and other relationships including individual, group and family counseling; 6) working in coordination with Correctional Officer and the Supervising Counselor in determining continuum of care services for the participants; 7) participation in case conferences and providing guidance in determining education & vocational goals; 8) providing specialized classes and workshops on relevant topics needed by participants; 9) maintaining clinical supervision, including development of the TRP, review of client’s files; and have the ability to perform initial and/or ongoing client assessments, and 10) working collaboratively with CDCR and California Institute for Women.
